Description: Sessions to help MESA teachers navigate a different type of school year. Instead of in person singular training, we will be utilizing a virtual module training method to support our advisors (teachers) in their teaching practices, assistance with project-based learning, our yearly theme of "Designing for Equity", and adapting their classroom and MESA program to a changing educational landscape. **Each module will be up to a full day of training, will be recorded for future viewing,** will provide opportunities for followup assistance, and will provide resources for continued learning. 25 teachers from the LANL support area will be supported along with up to 100 other teachers from across the state.

Event: STEM Series and Virtual Learning

Region(s): All

Date/Time: Year Round-To Start Mid September 2020-April 2021. Target Dates on MESA Calendar.

Location: Zoom/Website **Notes:** Done via Webinar.

Description: With the emerging need to supplement instruction virtually, MESA piloted their STEM Series in the Spring of 2020 in response to the emergency school site closures. Our STEM series brings professionals from across New Mexico and the country to interact with our MESA students, advisors, and general public. Sessions will be recorded for future use. Adjoining curriculum (3 Lessons) and materials will be provided with sessions to enhance the learning experience and assist our teachers with the adapted learning environment.

Event: MESA Buddies

Region(s): All

Date/Time: Year Round-To Start Spring 2021

Location: School Site/Virtual Platform

Notes: \$750 MESA advisor Stipend, \$250 EOY/Transport, \$500 Materials (Provided by MESA), 10 Lesson Curriculum. Applications to be distributed Mid-October, DUE December. Decision made by Program Coordinator with RC Input. Each region to have 1 site from State Budget, NO and NC an additional site, for a total of 10.

Description: MESA Buddies is a mentor program in which a MESA high school partners with a local elementary classroom (grades 2-4) to provide supplemental STEAM instruction and mentorship. A minimum of 10 STEAM lessons/interactions will be completed in the Spring of 2021. The MESA teacher will arrange for a team of high school students to work with the designated elementary students. Format will be determined by the current classroom restrictions and will either be done virtually in which material packs will be created and pre-distributed to each student for use in their own home or will be done in person and in small group interactions as determined by current social distancing restrictions. 4 sites from the LANL support area will be supported along with 4 other sites from across the state. Each site has the potential outreach impact of up to 40 students, 20 High School MESA students and 20 Elementary MESA Buddies.

Event: Virtual College and Career Pathways Experience

Region(s): All

Date/Time: November 9-13, Time TBD, Less Nov. 11 Holiday.

Location: Zoom

Notes: Done via Webinar. Program Coordinator to travel and collect base information. 200 College Packs will be created and mailed to attendees.

Description: This will be a week long virtual conference for High School students to select and participate in sessions via zoom. Traditionally our program provides and allows for multiple college visits through the year. With current contact restrictions and to provide equitable opportunity for all of our MESA students, we will convert this experience. Tracks will include sessions from Universities and College Prep Professionals with topics to include: Virtual Field Trip, University Services, What to Select in a University, FAFSA/Financial Aid, Standardized Tests, Admission with COVID, Adapting to a Changing Learning Environment and more. This experience has the potential outreach impact of up to 300 High School students and 25 teachers from the LANL support area along with over 1,900 High School students and 100 additional teachers from across the state.

Event: AMP Conference

Region(s): Statewide

Date/Time: October 9, 2020

Location: Virtual

Notes: NM MESA Students will be invited to participate in general sessions and student presentations. Registration to be done through MESA and conference monitored/set up by AMP. There is no current attendance limit, but registrants MUST attend. Open to current high school, but target is 11th-12th grade or mature underclassmen. Students will start with a MESA presentation at the start of the day, attend selected workshops, and submit virtual handbook upon completion. No cost involved in attendance.

Description: The New Mexico AMP conference is a student research conference which focuses on the following fields: technology, engineering, science and math. The conference promotes New Mexican college minority students to communicate their research via oral presentations, poster displays and is a competition for both undergraduate and graduate students. The event invites NM MESA junior and senior students to participate and interact in college level presentations. The conference also allows for MESA workshops and seminars students can attend.

Event: Energy & Education Fair-Change to Energy Education Program

Date/Time: Spring-April and May. Application due March 2021

Location: Statewide

Notes: Interested schools can apply to attend the in-person event. Students are given the opportunity to discover job possibilities in the many different areas that are related to the energy industry and attend quality workshops, as well as visit industry sites. This event will be open to middle and high school students.
